FINDING OURSELVES IN A LIMINAL SEASON

PASTOR NATE TOSO

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

These are familiar words of greeting from the pen of the Apostle Paul. They are words that I hope and pray for you during this time of transition. I pray that you are able to find grace and peace as you continue to do the sacred work of being church together even as you find yourselves in the midst of change.

At the same time that I pray for you, I ask that you also pray for me. As I write this article, I find myself in the strange place of anticipating that my call will soon begin at Redeemer (and being incredibly excited about that call!), at the same time, being aware that my call is currently to Beaver Lake Lutheran Church and knowing that I still have work to do there before I leave. I want to make sure to take the time to say goodbye to a congregation and to individual people who have been formative in my life as a person and as a pastor. I am in the middle of doing the often hard and grief-filled work of leaving a place. Even as that work can be difficult, I find it to be sacred work and I want to do it well.

As I reflect on all of this, I believe we find ourselves in a place that I would call an in-between time. For you, your time of interim has ended and you are in a time of waiting for a new thing to begin. For me, it is a period of saying goodbye while also anticipating my new call to Redeemer—a call back to a group of people who have also been incredible important in shaping me as a person and as a pastor. between-time can be a challenging time as changes continue to happen and we have important work to do, even as we wait for new things to begin.

Author, church consultant, coach, and spiritual director, Susan Beaumont refers to these in-between-times as "liminal seasons" or "liminal experiences" and she writes that "God works with liminality. Through liminal experiences human beings are transformed and brought into deeper relationships with God." (Beaumont, 2019, p. 2). Franciscan friar and author, Richard Rohr, adds that liminal experience is the "realm that God can best get at us." (Beaumont, 2019, p. 3)

Even though this in-between-time, this liminal season, might seem like a challenging place to be, I encourage you (and me!) to embrace this season remembering that it is often where "God can best get at us." I pray that during this time of waiting, this liminal season, that we are all "transformed and brought into deeper relationships with God."

May you find much grace and deep peace during this liminal season.

FINANCIAL UPDATE FROM THE TREASURER

As we head toward the final months of 2019, it is a good time to provide an update on Redeemer's financial picture for the year. The Redeemer Council has been busy with pastoral transitioning and temporary staffing for the Worship and Music Director position over the past several weeks, so this update comes in lieu of providing a verbal financial update at our usual October congregational update meeting.

God has blessed Redeemer with the call of Pastor Nate, and we look forward to his return to ministry with us. I have no doubt that Redeemer will thrive with his leadership.

As always, the Council and I thank you for everything you do to support Redeemer's continuing mission, both with your time and with your financial giving.

During pastoral and other staffing transitions, financial giving often dips, and that has been the case for Redeemer during the past several months. While our financial picture was robust through May, giving for the summer months and into the fall has lagged behind our budgeted

projections. Through September:


- Year-to-date giving is \$316,855. This is \$14,111 below our budgeted giving of \$330,966 (4.3% below budget). Giving in 2019 is \$16,466 lower than at this point in 2018.
- Year-to-date total income (including one-time gifts and grants, and income from the use of our building) is \$10,717 (3.0%) below the anticipated total.
- On a positive note, our expenses year-to-date are \$19,336 below our budget. The Council and staff have been keeping a close eye on expenses to ensure we do not over-extend Redeemer's finances.

As we come nearer to Advent, the Christmas season, and the end of the year, let us reflect with an Attitude of Gratitude on God's steadfast presence with Redeemer during this challenging transition year. May that Attitude of Gratitude lead you to consider further supporting Redeemer's mission with you additional time and treasure.
